TORONTO OFFICIAL PLAN AND MUNICIPAL COMPREHENSIVE REVIEWS

We all share a **common interest** in ensuring Toronto continues to be an attractive place to live, work, invest and play. The City of Toronto's Official Plan is the key policy document to manage and direct physical change in the city in the years ahead.

The City is beginning a review of its Official Plan as well as undertaking a Municipal Comprehensive Review under the Provincial Growth Plan that looks specifically at designated areas of employment in the Official Plan. Both Reviews will focus on how and where Toronto will grow.

Public consultation is an important part of the review process, and feedback will be sought in two stages. Stage 1 runs this fall including six open houses at civic centres across Toronto in September. Stage 1 discussion will focus on what's working with the current Official Plan and what areas could be improved. Stage 2 will present and seek feedback on opportunities to refine the Official Plan.
