## Sanitary Sewer Stand By Tanks on Parkside Drive 100 meters South of Bloor Street Located In High Park

Start Date: end of May 2017

End Date: Mid-June 2017



The City of Toronto will conduct seasonal maintenance work on the sanitary sewer underground stand by storage tanks for about three weeks. The tanks are located approximately 100 meters south of Bloor Street west of Parkside Drive in High Park. This work will help clear the drainage system to reduce the risk of basement flooding.

The sanitary sewer carries sewage from bathrooms, sinks, kitchens, and other plumbing components in homes to wastewater treatment plants. The sanitary service lateral is the pipe connecting your home's plumbing to the City's sewer, the part the City owns goes from the sewer and water main to your property line.

This work will require the occupation of the right south bound curb lane starting 100 meters south of Bloor Street for approximately 60 meters. This work will require the parking of heavy vacuum and water blasting equipment within the occupied area. There will be a temporary south bound lane closure daily Monday-Friday 9 am-5 pm from May 29, 2017 to June 16, 2017 (may change due to weather).

This project is part of the Council-approved 2017 Capital Works Program to improve drainage system and renew aging infrastructure reducing the risk of sewer collapse or blockages that cause sewer backups.



## WORK DETAILS

The City’s contractor will move equipment on-site and prepare the work area before construction begins. Construction crews will then:

- Maintenance (clean up) of City-owned sanitary trunk sewer pipes and underground storage tank
- Restore all work areas with asphalt, concrete or grass when the underground works AS REQUIRED

## WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.
- This work will not impact your water or drain services

	<p><b>Work Hours:</b> Work will take place from 8:00 am to 5:00 pm., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.</p>
	<p><b>Road and Sidewalk Access:</b> In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all time</p> <p>As there is no sidewalk on the west side of Parkside Drive, this area will be restricted for pedestrian access</p>
	<p><b>Traffic Management:</b> Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.</p>
	<p><b>Restoration:</b> The area will be restored immediately upon completion of the work</p>
